



Rosi Klose Bergenia Bergenia 'Rosi Klose'

Hardiness Zone: 4

Other Names: Giant Rockfoil, Largeleaf Saxifrage, Pigsqueak

Description:

Large glossy, leathery, cabbage-like leaves that turn burgundy late in the season; interesting clusters of repeat-blooming deep pink flowers rise above foliage; great for shady areas, water regularly but don't overwater

Ornamental Features

Rosi Klose Bergenia features unusual spikes of pink flowers rising above the foliage from early summer to mid fall. Its attractive large succulent round leaves are forest green in color with curious red undersides. As an added bonus, the foliage turns a gorgeous burgundy in the fall.

Landscape Attributes

Rosi Klose Bergenia is an herbaceous evergreen perennial with a ground-hugging habit of growth. Its wonderfully bold, coarse texture can be very effective in a balanced garden composition.

This is a relatively low maintenance plant, and is best cleaned up in early spring before it resumes active growth for the season. Deer don't particularly care for this plant and will usually leave it alone in favor of tastier treats. It has no significant negative characteristics.

Rosi Klose Bergenia is recommended for the following landscape applications;

- Mass Planting
- Border Edging
- General Garden Use
- Groundcover





Planting & Growing

Rosi Klose Bergenia will grow to be about 12 inches tall at maturity, with a spread of 18 inches. Its foliage tends to remain dense right to the ground, not requiring facer plants in front. It grows at a medium rate, and under ideal conditions can be expected to live for approximately 10 years. As an evegreen perennial, this plant will typically keep its form and foliage year-round.

This plant does best in partial shade to shade. It is very adaptable to both dry and moist locations, and should do just fine under typical garden conditions. It is not particular as to soil type or pH. It is highly tolerant of urban pollution and will even thrive in inner city environments. This particular variety is an interspecific hybrid. It can be propagated by division; however, as a cultivated variety, be aware that it may be subject to certain restrictions or prohibitions on propagation.
